Re: Response to September 6, 2025 Circulated Email – Request for Council Action

Councilwoman Springowski, Councilman Arroyo, Law Director LaVeck, Prosecutor Riley, members of the Lorain County Sheriff's Office, and Clerk Dull,

On September 6, 2025, Councilwoman Springowski circulated an email alleging that in my video I "plan to confront her in public." That message was forwarded to the Law Director, the Prosecutor's Office, the Sheriff's Office, and others. Because the email was distributed widely, I place this response in the public record and address each recipient directly.

As a constituent, my rights are guaranteed by **R.C. 121.22, the Ohio Open Meetings Act**, which ensures that the public may attend, observe, and participate in council proceedings, and by the **First Amendment to the United States Constitution**, which protects the right to petition government and engage in political speech. Attending meetings and addressing my representatives is not a threat; it is the essence of representative government.

Nothing in my video was threatening. I have never spoken to Councilwoman Springowski at a council meeting. To mischaracterize my video as a threat is to weaponize my speech against me. This is not an isolated incident. **Councilwoman Springowski participated in retaliatory tactics directed at me in the prior Hilton matter, where she forwarded my personal email directly to Tim Hilton outside of any public records request and without lawful redaction, despite Hilton having an active Civil Protection Order against me. That disclosure was improper and dangerous.**

For the record, the video that Councilwoman Springowski now cites as proof of a "threat" was made in response to that misconduct. My statement that I would "confront" her was not a threat of violence or any unlawful act. It was a declaration that I intended to hold her publicly accountable through lawful civic means. The attempt to twist that statement into a criminal accusation is nothing more than an effort to criminalize protected speech. Courts have repeatedly held that such retaliation is unlawful. See *Norwell v. Cincinnati*, 414 U.S. 14 (1973); *City of Houston v. Hill*, 482 U.S. 451 (1987).

The current circulation of my video to prosecutorial and law enforcement offices follows the same retaliatory playbook. I now state for the record that these coordinated efforts constitute harassment and retaliation. Councilwoman Springowski is falsely reporting to law enforcement that I am threatening her, and enough is enough. Such false accusations not only chill my constitutional rights but also amount to defamation, as they falsely impute criminal conduct to me in communications with third parties.

Retaliation by public officials is unlawful. Under Ohio law, a public servant who, under color of office, knowingly deprives a person of rights protected by the Constitution or laws of Ohio may be guilty of a crime (see R.C. 2921.45, Interference with Civil Rights). In addition to criminal exposure, such conduct may give rise to civil liability under 42 U.S.C. § 1983 and Ohio tort law, including defamation. Because the conduct at issue here has already occurred, I demand that all relevant communications, records, and metadata be preserved immediately, that the Clerk of Council and Law Director notify the appropriate prosecutorial authority to review these actions, and that Council open a formal oversight inquiry without delay. Failure to preserve evidence or to refer this matter for review will itself be noted in any future legal or administrative filing.

Councilman Arriyo, as my Ward representative, I remind you that I first asked you to represent me and take action when Councilwoman Springowski improperly forwarded my private email to Hilton without a records request and without redaction. You did not respond. I now renew that request in light of this new misconduct. You have a statutory duty under R.C. 731.05 to act as legislator for the City of Lorain and under R.C. 731.10 to exercise oversight of municipal officers and ensure that the business of council is conducted lawfully and openly. This duty is not ceremonial. It requires you to protect the public's right to attend, observe, and speak at council meetings under R.C. 121.22, and to intervene when other public officials attempt to chill or suppress those rights.

I now renew my demand that you place this matter on the council agenda for formal discussion and oversight. The forwarding of my video to law enforcement and prosecutors under the pretense that it constitutes a threat is not only a misuse of public office and resources but also a potential violation of R.C. 2921.45 (**Interference with Civil Rights**).

When a councilmember recasts peaceful civic engagement as a criminal threat and circulates that narrative to law enforcement, it undermines the very statutory guarantees you are duty-bound to uphold. The United States Supreme Court has made clear that such tactics violate the Constitution. In *Norwell v. City of Cincinnati*, 414 U.S. 14 (1973), the Court held that a citizen may not be punished merely for "non-provocatively voicing his objection" to government action.

In *City of Houston v. Hill*, 482 U.S. 451 (1987), the Court struck down an ordinance criminalizing verbal challenges to police, emphasizing that the First Amendment protects “a significant amount of verbal criticism and challenge directed at police officers.” In *Nieves v. Bartlett*, 587 U.S. ____ (2019), the Court reaffirmed that retaliation against lawful expressive conduct—even when officials claim to perceive it as hostile—is impermissible.

Ohio courts have likewise recognized that the Open Meetings Act must be liberally construed in favor of openness and participation. In *State ex rel. White v. Cleveland*, 125 Ohio St.3d 526 (2010), the Ohio Supreme Court stressed that transparency and public participation are fundamental obligations of government. In *State ex rel. Fairfield Leader v. Ricketts*, 56 Ohio St.2d 97 (1978), the Court held that public officials may not conduct business in a manner that deters or excludes citizens. These rulings reinforce that the law presumes in favor of citizen participation—not suppression.


Your failure to investigate or respond compounds the problem. As my Ward representative, you are obligated to ensure that public resources are not weaponized against constituents and that council business is not conducted in a retaliatory or exclusionary manner. Allowing false accusations of threats to stand unchallenged violates both constitutional precedent and statutory duty under R.C. 731.05, R.C. 731.10, and R.C. 121.22.

I will continue to attend and participate in council meetings peacefully, lawfully, and within my constitutional rights. **Continued attempts to classify or prosecute my protected speech as criminal conduct will be treated as retaliatory actions. Such conduct will be documented and may give rise to claims under both Ohio and federal law.**

Let the record reflect that I expressly reserve all rights under R.C. 149.43, the Ohio Public Records Act, and under 42 U.S.C. § 1983, the federal civil rights statute, to pursue remedies if my speech and participation are further mischaracterized or if public officials, acting under color of law, retaliate against me for exercising my rights.

Re: Request for Council Oversight – Misuse of Public Office, Harassment, Retaliation, and Conflict of Interest

Pursuant to **R.C. 731.05** and **R.C. 731.10**, which vest legislative authority and oversight responsibility in council members, and **R.C. 121.22 (Ohio Open Meetings Act)**, which guarantees public participation and transparency, I respectfully request that Lorain City Council place on its next agenda a discussion and investigation into Councilwoman Mary Springowski's conduct.

The authority of city council members is not ceremonial. As the Ohio Supreme Court has held, municipal legislators are entrusted with both legislative and oversight duties to ensure that government operations are lawful, transparent, and protective of citizen rights. See *State ex rel. White v. Cleveland*, 125 Ohio St.3d 526 (2010). This duty includes preventing retaliation and misuse of public office against constituents.

First, Councilwoman Springowski previously forwarded my private email directly to Tia Hilton without a lawful public records request and without required redaction, despite Hilton having an active Civil Protection Order against me. Such conduct violated not only the **Ohio Public Records Act (R.C. 149.43)**, which prescribes procedures and exemptions for disclosure, but also **Lorain Codified Ordinance 109.02**, which incorporates state public records obligations into municipal practice.

Second, on September 6, 2025, Councilwoman Springowski circulated an email alleging that I "plan to confront her in public," which she forwarded to the Law Director, the Prosecutor's Office, and the Sheriff's Office. This was an effort to recast my protected speech as a criminal threat, when in fact my statement was a declaration of intent to hold her publicly accountable through lawful civic means.

Legal Standards on “True Threats”

It is essential for Council to recognize that my statement does not meet the constitutional definition of a true threat. The United States Supreme Court has long held that only *true threats* fall outside the First Amendment.

- In **Watts v. United States**, 394 U.S. 705 (1969), the Court ruled that a citizen’s statement about “getting [the President] in my sights” was political hyperbole, not a threat, because context showed no serious intent to commit violence.
- In **Virginia v. Black**, 538 U.S. 343 (2003), the Court defined a true threat as a statement where the speaker means to communicate a serious expression of intent to commit unlawful violence.
- In **Elonis v. United States**, 575 U.S. 723 (2015), the Court overturned a conviction for alleged threats posted on Facebook because prosecutors failed to prove the defendant’s subjective intent that his words be taken as a threat.
- In **Counterman v. Colorado**, 600 U.S. ___ (2023), the Court clarified that the First Amendment requires proof that the speaker acted with at least recklessness consciously disregarding a substantial risk that their words would be taken as a threat.

Ohio courts follow the same principle. See **State v. Smith**, 126 Ohio St.3d 108 (2010) (context and intent are essential), and **State v. Hoffman**, 57 Ohio St.2d 129 (1979) (mere angry words do not constitute threats).

Context of My Statement

For further clarity, my statement that I would “confront” a councilmember referred to the same kind of civic engagement I exercised when I confronted former Council President Joel Arredondo after a public meeting in City Hall. The City Council chamber and its adjoining lobby are the only true public forums where residents may directly address their representatives outside of the limited public comment period. Courts have long held that speech in such public forums receives the strongest First Amendment protection. See **Perry Educ. Ass’n v. Perry Local Educators’ Ass’n**, 460 U.S. 37 (1983); **United States v. Grace**, 461 U.S. 171 (1983).

When I used the word “confront,” I meant engaging a councilmember in this civic, nonviolent, and constitutionally protected manner. To treat such conduct as a “threat” is to criminalize ordinary constituent participation in its only available forum.

Retaliation and Liability

These actions constitute harassment and retaliation. They implicate **R.C. 2921.45 (Interference with Civil Rights)**, which makes it a criminal offense for a public servant, under color of office, to knowingly deprive any person of rights secured by law. They further expose the City of Lorain to civil liability under **42 U.S.C. § 1983**, which provides a federal cause of action for retaliation against First Amendment activity. In addition, to the extent Councilwoman Springowski’s statements falsely impute criminal conduct to me, they amount to **defamation per se** under Ohio law.

Because retaliation has already occurred, I demand that:

1. **All related records, emails, texts, and metadata** be preserved immediately in compliance with both state law and **Lorain Codified Ordinance 109.01 (Records Commission)**, which requires the retention of public records.
2. **The Clerk of Council and the Law Director** notify the appropriate prosecutorial authority for criminal review of potential violations of **R.C. 2921.45** and related statutes.
3. **Lorain City Council exercise its oversight authority under R.C. 731.05** to hold a formal inquiry and ensure that the misuse of office, retaliation, and harassment of constituents does not continue.

Duty to Recuse

Because this matter involves Councilwoman Mary Springowski's own conduct, she has a clear conflict of interest and must not participate in any deliberations or votes concerning this request. Under **Ohio Ethics Law, R.C. 102.03(D) and (E)**, no public official may use or authorize the use of their office to secure an improper benefit for themselves or to influence matters where their personal conduct is under review. Further, **Lorain Codified Ordinance 159.01 et seq. (Ethics and Conduct)** prohibits councilmembers from participating in decisions in which they have a direct personal interest.

Accordingly, I demand that Councilwoman Springowski recuse herself entirely from any consideration of this matter and that her recusal be formally noted in the minutes.

Failure to preserve evidence, notify the proper prosecutorial authority, or ensure recusal will itself be noted in the public record and may be raised in future administrative, civil, or criminal proceedings.

Thank you for providing the information received from the City of Lorain regarding Mr. Resendez's SF-400 form.

Below is my opinion regarding his status as a "Special" police officer.

According to the SF-400 form you have received, Richard Resendez is appointed by Lorain Safety Director Sanford Washington as a "special" police officer with the City of Lorain in alignment with Ohio Revised Code Section 737.051. The Code states in part, "The legislative authority of a city may establish, by ordinance, an auxiliary police unit within the police department of the city, and provide for the regulation of auxiliary police officers." Please note, the Code does not confer any powers of arrest or other duties commonly vested with commissioned police officers.

Of special note, Resendez is defined pursuant to his appointment by the City of Lorain as a "Special" police officer and not an "Auxiliary" officer. Other "Special" police officers that have been appointed by the City of Lorain include Ernest "Buddy" Sivert. The appointment was from 2/4/2021 until 12/2/2022. Sivert was appointed the same date as Resendez but resigned from his appointment to begin employment with the Lorain County Constables on 2/21/2022 - the same date as Resendez.

Other officers appointed as "Special" police officers with Lorain Police Department include: Efrain Torres, David Kuszniir, Ricardo Soto, Reuben Figueroa, John Manion, Keith Riggs and Jeremy Tavenner

In searching for appointments of Auxiliary Police Officers for the City of Lorain pursuant to R.C. 737.051, I could not locate any officers appointed as auxiliary officers. Even the auxiliary chief of police Malick is listed as "Inactive." Chief Malick is a former full time Lorain Police Officer.

Next, we need to address the commissioning of officers as well pursuant to the definition of "peace officer" as well as those who are conferred the authority of arrest under the Ohio Revised Code.

The SF-400 form as prescribed by the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission and recorded by the Ohio Attorney General is to provide official notice of "Peace Officer Appointment" by a "Reporting Authority" which is usually an administrative member of a recognized law enforcement agency in the State of Ohio. The appointment is confirmed by the peace officer being administered an oath of office by the appointing authority which is a political subdivision or other recognized authority to appoint peace officers in Ohio (i.e. banks, railroads, nuclear regulatory commissions, etc.).

A "Peace Officer" is defined under Ohio Revised Code Section 2935.01 as, ". . . except as provided in section 2935.081 of the Revised Code, a sheriff; deputy sheriff; marshal; deputy marshal; member of the organized police department of any municipal corporation, including a member of the organized police department of a municipal corporation in an adjoining state serving in Ohio under a contract pursuant to section 737.04 of the Revised Code; member of a police force employed by a metropolitan housing authority under division (D) of section 3735.31 of the Revised Code; member of a police force employed by a regional transit authority under division (Y) of section 306.35 of the Revised Code; state university law enforcement officer appointed under section 3345.04 of the Revised Code; enforcement agent of the department of public safety designated under section 5502.14 of the Revised Code; employee of the department of taxation to whom investigation powers have been delegated under section 5743.45 of the Revised Code; employee of the department of natural resources who is a natural resources law enforcement staff officer designated pursuant to section 1501.013 of the Revised Code, a forest-fire investigator appointed pursuant to section 1503.09 of the Revised Code, a natural resources officer appointed pursuant to section 1501.24 of the Revised Code, or a wildlife officer designated pursuant to section 1531.13 of the Revised Code; individual designated to perform law enforcement duties under section 511.232, 1545.13, or 6101.75 of the Revised Code; veterans' home police officer appointed under section 5907.02 of the Revised Code; special police officer employed by a port authority under section 4582.04 or 4582.28 of the Revised Code; police constable of any township; police officer of a township or joint police district, a special police officer employed by a municipal corporation at a municipal airport, or other municipal air navigation facility, that has scheduled operations, as defined in section 119.3 of Title 14 of the Code of Federal Regulations, 14 C.F.R. 119.3, as amended, and that is required to be under a security program and is governed by aviation security rules of the transportation security administration of the United States department of transportation as provided in Parts 1542, and 1544, of Title 49 of the Code of Federal Regulations, as amended; the house of representatives sergeant at arms if the house of representatives sergeant at arms has arrest authority pursuant to division (E)(1) of section 101.311 of the Revised Code; an assistant house of representatives sergeant at arms; the senate sergeant at arms; an assistant senate sergeant at arms; officer or employee of the bureau of criminal identification and investigation established pursuant to section 109.51 of the Revised Code who has been awarded a certificate by the executive director of the Ohio peace officer training commission attesting to the officer's or employee's satisfactory completion of an approved state, county, municipal, or department of natural resources peace officer basic training program and who is providing assistance upon request to a law

enforcement officer or emergency assistance to a peace officer pursuant to section 109.54 or 109.541 of the Revised Code, a state fire marshal law enforcement officer described in division (A)(23) of section 109.71 of the Revised Code, a gaming agent, as defined in section 3772.01 of the Revised Code; and, for the purpose of arrests within those areas, for the purposes of Chapter 5503. of the Revised Code, and the filing of and service of process relating to those offenses witnessed or investigated by them, the superintendent and troopers of the state highway patrol."

Further, Section 109.71 of the Revised Code defines a peace officer as the following:

(A) "Peace officer" means:

Show Quoted Content

(A) "Peace officer" means:

Richard Resendez is appointed as a "Special" police officer pursuant to the City of Lorain which is a political subdivision of the State of Ohio and has the authority to confer appointments of peace officers. The Lorain Police Department is a recognized municipal police department by the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission and the Office of the Ohio Attorney General. Resendez is not appointed as a municipal police officer.

In review of the above-listed sections of the Ohio Revised Code which define a "Peace Officer," Special Police Officer is identified as a peace officer under Ohio law in the following circumstances:

- One who is employed by the department of mental health and addiction services pursuant to section 5119.08 of the Revised Code or the department of developmental disabilities pursuant to section 5123.13 of the Revised Code;
- One who is designated by the superintendent of the state highway patrol pursuant to section 5503.09 of the Revised Code or a person who was serving as a special police officer pursuant to that section on a permanent basis on October 21, 1997, and who has been awarded a certificate by the executive director of the Ohio peace officer training commission attesting to the person's satisfactory completion of an approved state, county, municipal, or department of natural resources peace officer basic training program;
- One who is employed by a port authority under section 4582.04 or 4582.28 of the Revised Code or a person serving as a special police officer employed by a port authority on a permanent basis on May 17, 2000, who has been awarded a certificate by the executive director of the Ohio peace officer training commission attesting to the person's satisfactory completion of an approved state, county, municipal, or department of natural resources peace officer basic training program;
- One who is employed by a municipal corporation who has been awarded a certificate by the executive director of the Ohio peace officer training commission for satisfactory completion of an approved peace officer basic training program **and** who is employed on a permanent basis on or after March 19, 2003, at a municipal airport, or other municipal air navigation facility, that has scheduled operations, as defined in section 119.3 of Title 14 of the Code of Federal Regulations, 14 C.F.R. 119.3, as amended, and that is required to be under a security program and is governed by aviation security rules of the transportation security administration of the United States department of transportation as provided in Parts 1542 and 1544. of Title 49 of the Code of Federal Regulations, as amended;

None of the peace officer definitions apply to an individual who is employed by an organized municipal police department who are, "... part-time employees, to be known as special policemen, during holidays or other special occasions," as defined by Lorain City Ordinance 131.04 entitled, "Special Police."

The Revised Code Sections which pertain to defining peace officers are very specific as intended by the Ohio General Assembly. In fact, the Lorain City legislative authority acted with parallel specificity when defining Special Police Officers and Auxiliary Police Officers. Per Lorain City Ordinance 131.05 it states in-part, "Pursuant to the provisions of Section 737.051, Ohio Revised Code, there is hereby established a Reorganized Lorain Police Auxiliary Unit within the Lorain Police Department, which auxiliary unit shall continue to be known as the Lorain Police Auxiliary, and which shall be subject to the following"

Lorain City Council defined auxiliary police officers as, "within the Lorain Police Department," - an organized municipal police department. However, Lorain City Council never included Special Police Officers as members of the organized municipal police department. Additionally, Lorain City Ordinance does not state that Special Police Officers are established pursuant to Revised Code Section 737.051.

Additionally, Auxiliary Police Units and Special Police are granted specific authorities by their political subdivisions. Lorain City Council has not granted the auxiliary police unit or special police powers of arrest or to act as peace officers as defined by the Ohio Revised Code. Peace officer definitions and appointments have been argued above and powers of arrest without warrant are reserved for peace officers and other very specific circumstances as defined by Revised Code 2935.03

In contrast, examples of municipal corporations who have granted peace officer and arrest authority to auxiliary and special police are enumerated below.

Madeira, Ohio Auxiliary Police Officer Ordinance:

- § 32.09 AUXILIARY POLICE UNIT ESTABLISHED. (A) An auxiliary police unit is established within the Police Department of the city. The City Manager shall be the executive head of the unit and shall make all appointments of officers to and removals of officers from the unit. The Manager shall prescribe rules and regulations for the organization, training, administration, control and conduct of the unit and the members thereof. The members of the unit shall be volunteers and shall not be entitled to receive compensation as officers thereof or for any services or duties performed by them while acting as officers thereof except for reimbursement of expenses as may be specifically prescribed by the Manager, and, in such event, the Manager shall also prescribe the amount of reimbursement for such expenses. (B) **Officers of the auxiliary police unit shall and are hereby vested with all police powers including the power to pursue, arrest and detain persons violating the law of the state and ordinances of the city in accordance with such written policies and regulations as may be approved by the City Manager and Chief of Police.**(C) The City Manager shall state the period for which the officer or officers are to serve and the power vested in the officers. However, the Manager shall have the authority to re-deputize any officer upon expiration of the term. (1985 Code, § 32.09) (Ord. 90-85, passed 12-17-1990; Ord. 92-14, passed 4-6-1992)

Dayton, Ohio Special Police Ordinance:

- The powers and duties of all persons licensed under the provisions of §§ 112.180 through 112.195 shall be:

(A) To obey the orders of the Director of Police.

(B) To be permitted to carry arms and have the power of arrest only when on duty and in the scope of his employment and then only in compliance with R.C. § 2923.12.

(C) To obey and comply with all rules and regulations for special police officers and special police agencies as set forth by the Director of Police.

(D) When on duty and in the scope of his employment a special police officer:

1. May work in uniform or not in uniform: provided, however, that any uniform that is worn shall be approved as to color and style by the Director of Police.
2. When in uniform shall wear a shoulder patch on the left sleeve, bearing the name of the agency by whom employed, the color and design to be approved by the Director of Police.
3. When in uniform shall wear the special police badge issued by the city on the left breast of the outermost garment.
4. May drive a vehicle in the course of his employment only after the color, equipment, and apparatus have been approved by the Director of Police. The Director of Police may waive the uniform and badge requirements for any industrial manufacturer or other private business concern which employs its own guard or security force and requires them to be licensed special police officers.

(E) A special police officer who notifies the Department of Police of the commission of a crime shall not, after such notification, conduct an investigation into the matter without the consent of the Department of Police. During an investigation of any crime, the Department of Police reserves the right to stop a special police officer from investigating or interfering in any way with the Department of Police.

Qualifications for persons to be eligible for sheriff under Ohio Revised Code Section 311.01 include:

- The qualified applicant will hold a current valid peace officer certificate of training issued by the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission or have been issued a certificate of training pursuant to section 5503.05 of the Revised Code; or,
- The qualified applicant will have been employed full-time by a law enforcement agency performing duties related to the enforcement of statutes, ordinances, or codes for a minimum of thirteen consecutive pay periods within the four-year period prior to the qualification date.

I believe Rich Resendez is not qualified to be eligible for the office of Lorain County Sheriff for the following reasons:

- Resendez does not currently possess a "valid" peace officer training certificate pursuant to ORC 5503.05 as his peace officer certification is based upon attestation of the Lorain Police Department and appointment by the City of Lorain to a position that is not recognized by Ohio Law as a defined peace officer. The Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission shall be informed of this issue for appropriate disposition of his certificate which includes revocation of his peace officer certification.
- Resendez has not been employed full-time by a law enforcement agency performing duties related to the enforcement of statutes, ordinances or codes for a minimum of thirteen

consecutive pay periods within a four-year period prior to the qualification date of January 6, 2025.

- Resendez was last employed full time by the Lorain County Sheriff's Office from 9/5/2017 through 1/4/2021. This full time employment is outside the four-year period prior to the qualification date of January 6, 2025.
- Resendez was employed as a full time "Constable" from February 21, 2022 through March 21, 2023 with Sheffield Township. However, this status as a Constable was deemed incompatible with his position as lead investigator or lead Secret Service Agent for the Lorain County Prosecutor's Office which he began in January, 2021. A Secret Service Agent is appointed pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 309.07 and is not considered a peace officer under Ohio Law. They simply assist the prosecutor in the collection and discovery of evidence to be used in trial. However, a secret service agent is considered a law enforcement officer in Lorain County for these purposes but does not enforce statutes, ordinances or codes nor do they make warrantless arrests.
- In a 2023 Ohio Attorney General Opinion, Ohio Attorney General Dave Yosts found the positions of Township Constable (Sheffield Township) and Secret Service Agent for the Prosecutor's Office (Lorain County) were incompatible due to overlying jurisdictions in the same county and giving way to conflicts of interest.
- Due to the attorney general opinion, the Sheffield Township constables (known by the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission as the "Lorain County Constables" was abolished
- Additionally, Resendez was on the payroll full-time as an employee of the Lorain County Prosecutor's Office. To date, no records have been located that Resendez or any constable was a full-time employee of Sheffield Township where the Lorain Constables Department was recognized and Sheffield Township Trustee Chad Parsons was recognized as the Chief of Police. Please note, Chad Parsons does not hold an Ohio Peace Officer Training Certification. Thus, Resendez was not a full time law enforcement officer for purposes of complying with R.C. 311.01

I believe this issue should be brought before the administrative judge of the Lorain County Common Pleas Court for review of the application for qualification to be sheriff as I feel the "Order of Candidacy" issued by Judge Ewers may have been issued based upon misleading information

I'd now like all hours Rich Resendez has worked as a special officer or as "auxiliary" since certification by the City of Lorain, and Chief McCann.

Also why Chief McCann made Rich an auxiliary officer after he left the LPD and went to the LCSO?

What is Rich's role with the city of Lorain?

As Rich is still an employee under Lorain Rules as an Auxiliary/Special Officer (even an unpaid one) I'm going to need his employment file and recent certifications he has submitted to retain his Certification and the Hours worked to maintain his Auxiliary status :

(b) The Chief of Police of the Lorain Police Department shall have exclusive control over the stationing and assignment of the members of the Reorganized Lorain Auxiliary Police Unit, subject to the Rules and Regulations hereinafter adopted.

(Ord. 128-99, Passed 7-19-99.)

(c) Members of the Reorganized Lorain Police Auxiliary shall not receive any salary or other compensation as members of the Lorain Police Auxiliary, except that the Chief of Police may compensate members of the Auxiliary for certain work at the rate of \$7.00 per hour as the Chief deems necessary and appropriate, and for which pay the members shall be entitled to participate in the Public Employees Retirement System. The hourly rate shall increase to \$8.00 per hour on January 1, 2001; \$9.00 per hour on January 1, 2002; and \$10.00 per hour on January 1, 2004.

(d) The members of the Auxiliary shall work a minimum of ninety-six (96) non-paid hours per year. On January 1, 2004, the minimum non-paid hours shall increase to one hundred and forty-four (144) hours per year.)

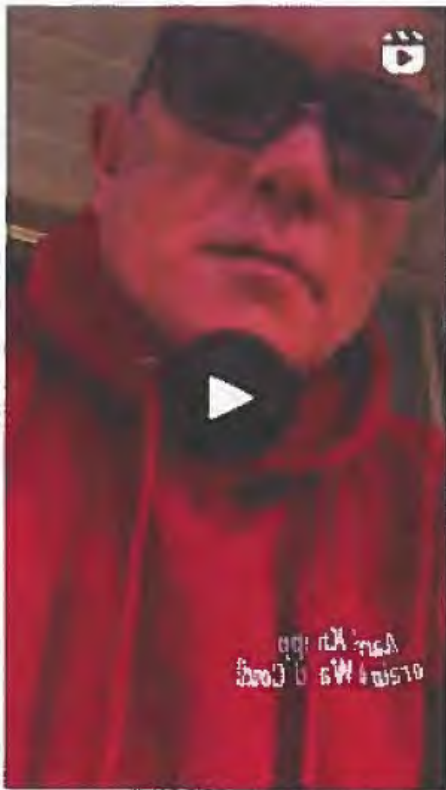

1. **BACKGROUND:** In August/September 2024, I was asked by the Lorain Law Department to assist with drafting a formal procedure for Lorain City Council committee chairpersons and council presidents to address disruptive behavior during lawful meetings. A written step-by-step procedure was finalized in September 2024 and provided to Lorain City Council. The procedure is clear and when followed, establishes reasonable suspicion to conduct a criminal investigation and to determine if probable cause exists to formally bring criminal charges against the suspect.

2. On Tuesday, February 18, 2025, I received your memorandum complaint about possible criminal misconduct perpetrated by Tia Hinton at the regular Lorain City Council meeting on Monday, February 17, 2025. The investigation was assigned to Deputy Chief Mike Palfing.

3. DC Palfing reviewed all relevant information discovered during his investigation and after consulting with the Lorain City Prosecutor's Office, he made the determination there was insufficient probable cause to charge Tia Hinton with the crime of Disturbing a Lawful Meeting. Failure of the Lorain Council President to follow the established procedure was the primary reason for this determination.

4. We must be very cautious when making decisions to charge a citizen who has the right to address their government, even if we don't like what they are saying. It is imperative that the president of council and EVERY council member who chairs a committee follow the procedures to the letter. I want to point out that even if the procedures are followed to the letter, that in and of itself does not establish probable cause to charge a citizen with the crime of Disturbing a Lawful Meeting. A probable cause determination will be made by the law enforcement officer present at the meeting or after a complete investigation and after consulting the Lorain City Prosecutor's Office.

1. I was input with reviewing the section of evidence submitted during the City Council meeting on February 17th, with particular relevance to Tim Wilson's conduct.
2. City Council meetings are considered limited public forums where the government may regulate speech through established rules of procedure and conduct. The City of Lorain provides a public comment sign to focus, allowing members of the public to express their concerns for a designated period. In this instance, Tim Wilson did not elect to address the council through the proper channels. In contrast, Jayne Horvath and Aaron Krupp followed the appropriate procedure at the start of the meeting.
3. During the meeting, while city business was being discussed, both Jayne Horvath and Tim Wilson made verbal comments from the audience. In addition to addressing City Council members directly, dialogue between audience members which further disrupted the meeting. After receiving the radio message and relevant documents, I found that Tim Wilson disrupted the meeting multiple times by making unauthorized statements from the audience area.
4. The Council President has an established procedure for handling disruptive behavior. If such behavior continues, the President may recess the meeting and suspend the council members he deems. In 2014 case, the disruptive behavior did not reach a level that the President deemed that action.
5. After consulting with the Prosecutor's Office, it has been determined that there is insufficient probable cause to pursue charges for disturbing a lawful meeting in the absence of the council members being alerted.



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To whom it may concern:

The attached information is connected to a series of dates in which the current Chief of Police at the Lorain police department was paid when he was not at work.

On 12/2/19 James McCann became the chief of police of the Lorain police. For months prior to being sworn in, McCann (JM) complained to multiple police officers, staff, colleagues, and other individuals that the prior chief was grossly under paid and that if his salary was not adjusted to his standard than he would not work 40 hours a week. JM did exactly that, he systematically began taking days off without putting the required time off submissions to be removed from his time banks. Every officer is required to submit a request in the department time tracking system when they take a day off, without exception. Being the chief of police, all of the top ranking personnel and his staff would know that he was not at work. It is a common practice that when a ranking officer is off for a regular duty day, the next higher ranking officer would get higher position pay, which is believed to be part of the police contract. When the chief of police is not at work for any of his regular scheduled days of work, the highest ranking Captain would get higher position pay. The three Captains this effected are M. Falling, R.Watkins, and L. Palmer. The only way these officers would get approved for higher pay was if JM was not at work at the police department facility. There are occasions where the chief maybe at training, meetings, seminars, etc in which a captain would get chiefs pay, but those are scheduled and should be documented in emails, time tracking, scheduling.

A review of payroll records indicates that JM took around 68 days off in which he received his regular pay, without any time being removed from his earned time banks and the captain that took on the chiefs responsibility was paid at the chiefs rate of pay. That means two officers were paid chiefs pay for those days. This information can be explained and confirmed by the Lorain auditor. If any officer except JM took time off and failed to put in a request, he would seek a criminal charge against that officer. It is rumored that the mayor, safety director, and law director know about this information and have ignored it or justified it, but has now stopped it. If it was legal or proper why would the practice be stopped. This list of ex officers and current officers can verify that JM told them that he would not work 40 hours a week until he gets a large raise, which he did!

R.Watkins, M.Falling, A. Cornwall, J. Fleming, E.Super, L.Palmer, E.Sivert, D.Reinhardt, D.Smith, R. Resendez, along with payroll staff, and city officials.

If Chief James McCann, claimed he worked from home or was working outside the office on every occasions, he lied. The information is in the enclosed documents, when a captain was paid higher position pay, JM was not at work, its that simple. If there is a legitimate reason for JM to be away from the police department than there should be a record , email, calendar, notes, or verbal notification to his captains. If a proper investigation is conducted these current and ex officers will not lie and the proof is in the documents, emails, phone records, etc.

I wonder how the tax payers in Lorain would feel if they knew they were paying a public employee to work "part time" and not only receive full pay, but cause other public officials who are below him to automatically make more money while he shirks his duties. JM might claim that that he is entitled to unaccounted time off with pay because he has to attend to his other duties, but I don't believe any other department leader (water, street, etc) get that benefit. And JM shouldn't either. He makes considerably more than his captains (according to publically available sources he makes more than \$168,000 a year, which makes him the second highest paid public employee in the county, right behind the coroner. According to those sources he makes as much as the governor)

If the mayor or law director try to justify this behavior, they should be investigated. Please look at the documents and question the right people

This should be properly investigated. The tax payers deserve transparency! No one is above the law!
